Five (5) At-Large Directors are elected biennially by a majority vote of the regular members of the Foundation. The Directors shall be elected for a two-year term and may be elected for one additional two-year term.

About My Sister's Place

The women and children who come to My Sister's Place frequently reside in night shelters or on the streets of Baltimore. They face constant hardship, struggling to survive a system that is unable to provide adequate and affordable housing, medical care or support services. The women who come to the shelter are unemployed, marginally employed or employed but confronted with serious obstacles, such as being physical abused, having chronic disabilities, being teenage mothers, serving as single heads of households or facing addictions. All the women who are provided services are poor and homeless. Staff work to restore hope and rebuild lives by providing resources from donors.
