

Key risk factors for cervical cancer include smoking,

STD infection, diet, long-term use (more than 10 years) of birth control and multiple pregnancies Although these factors increase the odds of getting cervical cancer, many women with these risk factors do not develop the disease.

Cervical cancer may be prevented or detected early by regular Pap tests. If it is detected early, it is one of the most successfully treatable cancers.
