Join the Fight—Support Our Black Farmers

Justice delayed is justice denied. That saying takes on special meaning for the 80,000-90,000 Black farmers who were discriminated against by the United States Department of Agriculture and are still owed compensation for the wrongs inflicted upon them.

President Obama's 2011 budget proposal includes \$1.2 billion in settlement monies for the Black agrarians. However, this case remains unsettled despite a notification by the Justice Department to the White House that a settlement is near. Meanwhile, the Black farmers continue to be victimized by an unjust system that fails to compensate them for their losses.

Join our Black farmers in this fight by contacting our senators to insist that they press for release of monies that will finally settle this debt to the Black farmers.
