**Our Soror, Liberian President Ellen** Johnson Sirleaf, Visits Baltimore

Among the vibrant colors of green, yellow, orange and red that represent the rich heritage of Africa were ribbons of pink and green, as dozens of Epsilon Omega Sorors helped fill Kraushaar Auditorium at Goucher College on April 16, 2009, to witness the coming of a highly celebrated member of their beloved sorority - Liberian President Ellen Johnson Sirleaf.

LaJerne Soror Cornish. Epsilon Omega's education committee chair and assistant professor of education at Goucher, received the honor of introducing Soror Sirleaf and wasted no time reciting the president's long list of achievements and her membership in Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc.

Known as the "Iron Lady," Soror Sirleaf emerged from behind curtains and took center stage as the audience applauded her stature as the first freely

and the cheered her connection to the world's first African American sorority.

After surviving a 14-year civil war and a government riddled with corruption, Liberia was ready for change. And, on January 16, 2006, the people of Liberia inaugurated Ellen Johnson Sirleaf as president. Having won a hotly contested election with the overwhelming support of women across Liberia, Sirleaf now faces the daunting task of lifting her country from debt and devastation.

At Goucher, she discussed the power of women, the economic state of her country, Liberia's natural resources and her imprisonment as a political refugee. She speaks of these experiences and others in her new book, This Child Will Be Great: Memoir of a Remarkable Life by Africa's First Female President.

"The day I was elected, the world unrepresented the power of women," Sirleaf said. "We are great. The women's movement has brought about both positive and negative change in all aselected female head of state in Africa pects including politics, but it has also

redefined what role women have in society and the world in general. And, it shows we can have any role."
