H1N1 virus is not much more threat- should be widely available in Septeming the few months of this new flu's among the first to get that shot. existence, hospitalizations and deaths from it seem to be lower than the average seen for seasonal flu, and the virus has not dramatically mutated. That's what health officials have observed in the Southern Hemisphere where flu season is now winding down. Still, more people are susceptible to swine flu, and U.S. health officials are worried because the H1N1 virus survived the summer—a time of year when the flu usually goes away.

Like seasonal flu, the H1NI Virus spreads through the coughs and sneezes of people who are sick. Washing your hands often will help protect you from germs. When soap and water are not available, alcohol-based disposable hand wipes or gel sanitizers may be used. When you wash your hands, do so with soap and warm water for at 15 to 20 seconds. If using an alcohol gel, rub your hands until the gel is dry.
