Morgan Names Lecture Hall to Honor Esteemed Professor of English


Dr. Ruthe T. Sheffey, Professor of English and longstanding member of the Department of English and Language Arts at Morgan State University, was honored recently in a dedication ceremony at the University's Communications Center on June 17, 2010. Dr. Sheffey, a graduate of Morgan State, has been a professor at her alma mater for more than 60 years, and is internationally known as an outstanding scholar of English Literature and educator. She is the founding president of the Zora Neal Hurston Society and editor of the Zora Neal Hurston Review. Her name is now a part of Morgan State University history with the naming of The Ruthe T. Sheffey Lecture Hall in the School of Communications.

Described by many as "a teacher par excellence," Dr. Sheffey has inspired such students as Pulitzer Prize winning writer James Alan McPherson, Presidential speechwriter Terry Edmonds—Clinton Administration—and singer Toni Braxton.
